

## #2 Plastic

- Empty plastic containers in a jug-like configuration labeled #2
- Milk jugs, detergent bottles, shampoo bottles, antifreeze/windshield washer fluid jugs, and some coffee cans and pill containers
- All lids should be removed and thrown into your garbage
- For safety and sanitary reasons please rinse containers before bringing them in for recycling
- No plastic products that you can clearly see through
- No Motor Oil Jugs Please
- No Plastic tubs, #2 or otherwise (butter, yogurt, or sour cream)

## Glass

- All non-tempered colored or clear glass products including jars, bottles, and older windowpane glass
- Decorative glassware such as vases and blown glass
- Clear drinking glasses and wine glasses
- Metal lids should be removed and disposed of in Tin Cans
- Glass should be free of food, candle wax, and any other material that is not glass
- No windshields or other tempered glass products
- No Ceramic Dishes or Pottery

## **Corrugated Cardboard**

- Cardboard of more than 2 Layers with a rippled air space between layers



- We can recycle both glossy and natural finished products in the same bin
- NO Wax Coated Cardboard Ever
- No Wet, Oil Soaked, Painted, or Dirty Cardboard Please

## **Newspaper & Magazine**

- Newspapers, magazines, and phone books
- No other material is acceptable in this product
- No newspapers or magazines still contained in plastic wrap
- Please do not use duct tape to bundle your recyclables

## **Mixed Paper**

- Office paper, construction paper, Cereal boxes, junk mail, and the likes there of
- No waxed products or products designed to hold a liquid
- No products designed to contain a refrigerated or frozen product (these products are known as WETSTRENGTH)
- WETSTRENGTH includes frozen pizza, TV Diner, and other frozen food packaging, soda and beer boxes, and paper yogurt packaging ++
- No carbonless paper or blueprint paper

## **Tin Cans**

- Empty metal cans of all shapes and sizes
- Empty aerosol cans
- Empty 1lb propane bottles
- Tin or Aluminum Foil
- Aluminum pie plates, roasting pans, and cookie sheets
- Other metal cooking utensils, pots, and pans
- Most any other metal scrap
- No thermostats, lighting ballasts, thermometers, or smoke alarms
