# Town of Oakland to join MainePERS effective October 1, 2021 for its' full-time police officers

To see if the Town of Oakland will vote to join the Maine Public Employees Retirement System (MainePERS) as a Participating Local District effective October 1, 2021, and:

- a.) To offer Special Plan 3C to its permanent, full-time police officers who work at least 40 hours per week, 52 weeks per year.
- b.) To authorize Gary Bowman, *Town Manager* to sign the agreement between the Town and Maine Public Employees Retirement System;
- c.) To exclude all other employees, including its elected officials and its election workers, from participating in MainePERS;

On August 11, 2021, the Oakland Town Council unanimously voted to offer to the "Oakland Full-Time Police Officers Association (Fraternal Order of Police)", under a side-bar agreement, Plan #3C of the Maine Public Employees Retirement System PLD Consolidated Plan.

On August 30, 2021, members of the "Oakland Full-Time Police Officers Association (Fraternal Order of Police) met, discussed, and voted unanimously to accept the change to "ARTICLE 21 – INSURANCE AND RETIREMENT" by adding:

SECTION-V – the Town will offer police department employees the opportunity to participate in the MainePERS Special Plan #3C and will pay the employers share of the contribution.

This agreement is entered into on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of September 2021 and will become a part of the "AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWN OF OAKLAND AND OAKLAND FULL-TIME POLICE OFFICERS ASSOCIATION (Fraternal Order of Police) immediately upon the signing of this document.
